Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all managing well in this very hot weather! This newsletter is mostly focused on our plans for the end of this term.

We are aware that many of our children have not been to school since 20th March. This is a long time and although we have done our very best to support them with our home learning package, we recognise the importance of giving them an opportunity to come into school before the summer break.

We have made a plan that allows us to give ALL children some time in school to say goodbye to their teachers and to meet their new teachers before September. Once the children have had this opportunity, they will break up for the summer holidays and their home learning will end too.

THE GREAT FIRE OF LONDON

This week, children in Year 1 have been learning about the Great Fire of London which happened on September 2nd 1666. The fire began in a small bakery in Pudding Lane.

The Luxembourg school bubbles took advantage of Mrs Hollyer lighting a fire in the firepit (wildlife garden) this week and they quickly mocked up Tudor styled cardboard houses that were then burnt. He children watched the houses burn whilst singing London's Burning and learnt from watching the fire that flames can become high and little splinters of wood can snap off and spread. This led to a discussion on how scary it would have been for the people who were living in London at the time. We then decided that they were very lucky to have the River Thames so most people escaped in boats and only six people died.
